# News from the Nurse's Office

#### **6TH GRADE PARENTS**

In order to start 7th grade, all students <u>must</u> have a physical exam performed *after* July 1, 2017 <u>AND</u> up to date vaccinations. The State of CT required vaccinations for 7th grade are:

Tetanus/diphtheria/pertussis (Tdap vaccine)
Meningitis (Menactra Vaccine)
Chicken Pox (Varicella vaccine #2)

Letters were sent out notifying parents whose children are missing documentation of these requirements.

If your child has met these requirements, but you have not yet sent in the documentation, please do so as soon as possible.

If your child is scheduled to receive their physical and vaccinations between now and the new school year, please send the documentation to the health room as soon as you have it.

If you are unsure if your child has already met these requirements, please contact the health room and we can let you know.

#### SEASONAL ALLERGIES

Spring is here and along with it, seasonal allergies. If your child suffers from seasonal allergies, please ensure they take their medication daily. Consistent use of medication along with preventative measures - frequent handwashing, wearing hat/sunglasses when outdoors, frequently changing pillow cases, flushing face with water after coming in from outdoors - are the best ways to minimize allergy symptoms.

Please feel free to contact us at any time if you have concerns regarding your child's health.


